CIMUN Information:

Badges:

Upon arrival to the conference, Delegates, Student Officers and MUN coordinators will receive a badge. This badge helps staff identify participants as a participant of the conference- without it, delegates may be refused entry into the conference or conference events during the following days. This badge also enables you to collect a sandwich for lunch (not applicable for CIS delegates). Please approach a member of the staff team if you have lost your badge.

Dress code:

The dress code for MUN conferences is strictly formal, and all participants of CIMUN shall dress in a formal western business attire while at the conference, with the exception of the social event. Clothing should be appropriate, and as such, jeans and sneakers are not in order, and a blazer must be worn above short sleeves. Miniskirts are not permitted, nor are turtlenecks, open-toed shoes, or national wear (country flag pins and the like are permitted). Headwear may only be worn for religious or cultural purposes.

Eating and Drinking:

Both eating and drinking are prohibited in the Theatre (where the Opening Ceremony takes place). Refreshments will be provided in each committee room however eating is not in order when the committee is in session. Eating should be done during caucuses (both moderated and unmoderated) or during lunchtime. Drinks such as coffee, tea and water are available throughout the conference day. **CIMUN is a non-substance conference; any consumption of alcohol or non-medical drugs are forbidden and will lead to being sent to the Secretary General, who will in turn report it to the delegate's MUN coordinator.**

Google Drive

CIMUN will be using Google drive for sharing and viewing of resolutions. It is also a good resource to use when delegates are lobbying with others, as it allows for multiple people to edit at once.

Language

The formal language of CIMUN is English, therefore all note-passing and dialogue when the committee is in session should be conducted in English. We also highly discourage the use of other languages during breaks.

When the committee is in session, both Chairs and Delegates are expected to use third person singular or first person plural to refer to themselves or their delegation. This does not apply to note passing.

Lunch

Lunch is available in the cafeteria. Delegates will be offered sandwiches which are available at the cafeteria. The delegate should show their badge to the staff when picking up their sandwich.

Preparation:

Position Papers are required for CIMUN. Position Papers should cover the topics being addressed as well as the delegates' countries' stance on it. They should be a minimum of one page. Delegates should write one, and then send it to the relevant student officers. Delegates are encouraged to draft clauses prior to the conference or draft resolutions. A position paper guide can be found on our website, ciscimun.com. Please note that we do make position papers mandatory, but they are for your sole benefit. CIMUN does not require opening statement in the committee; you may prepare one if you wish.

Punishments

Punishments are a fun addition to conferences, and are a way for delegates to release tension and relax. Punishments can be given for reasons such as lateness, usage of personal pronouns, violation of dress code and so on. If you do not wish to perform a punishment, please inform your chairs; no one will force you to do a punishment if you do not feel comfortable doing so.


Code of Conduct

Smoking and Vaping are forbidden within the school building, including the balcony and the rooftop. Delegates must go to the smoking area located under the bridge to the entrance of the school. **Any Delegate smoking/vaping in prohibited areas will be sent to the Secretary General.**

Additionally, we hope to foster a kind and supportive environment at CIMUN, and, as such, please be conscious of what you say, and how it could be offensive. This applies both while the committee is and is not in session. If it is your country's position that may be abrasive, please remember that many people may have a relation to the topics being discussed, and phrase your argument accordingly.

All delegates and chairs are expected to treat each other with respect, and failure to do so may result in being sent to the Secretary General.
