SOCIAL, HUMANITARIAN AND CULTURAL ISSUES (GENERAL ASSEMBLY 3)

Alarmed by the immense immigration from areas such as, but not limited to,

- I. The Middle East;
- II. Central and South America;
- III. Southeast Asia.

Deeply concerned about issues regarding mass-influx immigration, caused by issues such as, but not limited to,

- I. War;
- II. Starvation;
- III. Impoverishment;
- IV. Natural disasters.

Concerned by the unsafe circumstances that immigrants may face, when travelling to their final destination.

Calls for the following methods to be implemented:

- 1) Prevent the spread of human trafficking, through the creation of the United Nations Council for Prevention of Illegal Human Transportation (UNCPIHT) by, but not limited to:
 - a) increasing surveillance at places such as, but not limited to;
 - i) public transport;
 - ii) airports;
 - iii) immigrant communities;
 - iv) areas known for prostitution;
 - v) large agricultural fields;
 - vi) resort communities;
 - (1) health care providers;

- b) Looking for perpetrators and victims through identifying suspicious behavior and attributes such as, but not limited to:
 - i) scars;
 - ii) wounds;
 - iii) bruises;
 - iv) malnourishment
 - c) supporting victims through mental and physical health assistance;
 - d) promoting victim-centered law, which grants victims certain rights
- 2) Calls upon member states to recognize the economic and social benefits of welcoming immigrants, and notes the improved overall performance of these immigrants by implementing the following:
- a) Offering more university courses in English/Spanish/Arabic;
 - b) Providing language education for newly arrived immigrants/refugees;
 - c) Promoting an easier immigration process.
- 3) Offer financial support for the first 6 months after arrival
- 4) Improve the distribution of all types of immigrants per each country, through, but not limited to:
- a) Setting a minimum requirement of 5000 immigrants per 1,000,000 citizens;
 - b) basing the accommodated amount on population density, GDP, GNI and HDI,
- 5) Suggests financial support for border countries of states experiencing unrest, including support from NGOs and the UNCPIHT,
- 6) Further calls upon member states to ban unqualified immigrants from entering their country entirely.
